- take line management responsibility for all teaching school employees
- commit to meeting regularly with the TSBM and TSAO to drive forward the work of the alliance and to evaluate its impact
- provide a termly report to the Governing Body of Uplands Primary School
- provide a Strategic Plan for the TS and update termly

All Alliance Members

All members will:

- work collaboratively and inclusively to achieve the aims and objectives of the alliance
- adopt, where appropriate, any policies developed
- consider the involvement of the alliance in school improvement planning
- support the alliance by implementing any agreed actions
- subject to capacity, supply system leaders to support the alliance
- explain and promote the work of the alliance to non-alliance schools and providers
- respect the sensitive nature of some of the alliance's work and maintain confidentiality
- understand the need to work with strategic partners to quality assure the work of the alliance
- have the option of a visit from a Teaching School Consultant to review individual schools needs and strengths as a member of the Alliance.
